The 1948 Rule, also known as the female line rule, pertains to the policies granting Italian citizenship jure sanguinis for those with female ancestors. Prior to January 1, 1948 - the date the Italian Constitution was adopted - women could hold but not pass citizenship to their children. This changed with the modern Italian Constitution that granted equality of rights, giving men and women the same rights in regard to passing on citizenship, but prior policies still remain in place for ...

Italian citizenship is currently regulated by Law No. 91/1992 (and related implementing regulations: in particular, Presidential Decree No. 572 of October 12, 1993 and Presidential Decree No. 362 of April 18, 1994) which, unlike the previous Law, revalues the importance of individual intention in the acquisition or loss of citizenship and recognises the right to hold more than one citizenship at the same time.

Constitution of the Italian Republic

According to Italian nationality law, if an Italian woman was your ancestor and she was not born after January 1st, 1948, then Italian citizenship can be granted to her children as long as they were born after January 1st, 1948. Several appeals have been made against this law. The High Court of Rome has held 7 trials for the appeals to be heard.

Date: 1992 - Italy Allows Dual Citizenship August 15, 1992 Italy substantially revised its citizenship laws (Law no. 91 of February 5, 1992, attached below) to make dual citizenship more accepted. Prior to August 16, 1992, adult Italian citizens who naturalized with another country lost their Italian citizenship.

The citizenship provisions of the Fourteenth Amendment may be seen as a repudiation of one of the more politically divisive cases of the nineteenth century. Under common law, free persons born within a state or nation were citizens thereof. In the Dred Scott case, 2 however, Chief Justice Taney, writing for the Court, ruled that this rule did not apply to freed slaves.
