Though laparoscopic surgery for colorectal cancer offers a number of patient benefits compared to open surgery, such as less invasiveness and pain, speedier recovery, better cosmetic results, milder morbidity, earlier time to walking, flatus, and oral intake, and quicker recovery with a shorter hospital stay, several limitations and disadvantages are associated with conventional laparoscopic surgery.

Although many studies have suggested that laparoscopic surgery is superior to open surgery, the acceptance of this technique for colorectal cancer has been rather slow in clinical practice [2, 3]. One of the reasons for the low penetration of this procedure is laparoscopic colon resections which are technically demanding procedures and as such were initially prohibitive for the majority of surgeons [4].

Laparoscopic versus Open Surgery for Colorectal Cancer: A ...

Laparoscopic colorectal surgery avoids the need for a long incision (cut) in the abdomen (tummy) and so there is significantly less pain after the operation from the wound. It also means that you stay in hospital a shorter time (a matter of days) and can return to normal activities in a few weeks.

CHICAGO-Laparoscopic surgery does not appear to change the odds of survival compared with open surgery in the treatment of liver metastases in patients with colorectal cancer, according to the randomized OSLO-COMET trial (abstract LBA3516).

Laparoscopic Colorectal Cancer Surgery In patients with colorectal cancer who have multiple metastases to the liver and/or other distant sites (precluding curative surgical excision), removal of a short intestinal segment bearing the primary tumor with clear margins is often readily accomplished using laparoscopic techniques.
