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### Mutual Recognition And Decentralised Procedure

Mutual Recognition Procedure Decentralized Procedure As specified by the European Medicines Agency (EMA), the procedures are based on the type of the product and the number of countries in which the medicine is intended to be marketed.

### What is Centralized Procedure, Decentralized Procedure ...

The Coordination Group for Mutual Recognition and Decentralised Procedures - Human ( CMDh) was set up in 2005. It replaced the informal Mutual Recognition Facilitation Group. The CMDh examines questions relating to the marketing authorisation of human medicines in two or more European Union (EU) Member States in accordance with the mutual recognition or the decentralised procedure, and questions concerning variations of these marketing authorisations.

### Coordination Group for Mutual Recognition and ...

The decentralised procedure was introduced by Directive 2004/27/EC. As the mutual recognition procedure, it is also based on recognition by national authorities of a first assessment performed by one Member State. The difference lies in that it applies to medicinal products which have not received a marketing authorisation at the time of application.

### Authorisation procedures - The decentralised procedure ...

The mutual recognition procedure (MRP) is the procedure for obtaining marketing authorisation for a medicinal product initiated in the Concerned Member States (CMS) after approval in the Reference Member State (RMS) , and is compulsory for medicinal products that are not subject to the centralised or decentralised procedures for obtaining the marketing authorisation and will be marketed in more than one EU Member State, as laid down by Directive 2001/83/EC, as amended and the Medicinal ...

### Mutual recognition procedure /decentralised procedure - JAZMP

Applications in Mutual Recognition and Decentralised Procedures' (Rev 3, June 2007) • CMDh Q&A No 1: The CMDh has agreed that a duplicate application of a medicinal product authorised via the Mutual Recognition Procedure can be accepted via the Decentralised Procedure, provided that the same Reference Member State is used.

### Guidance on handling of Decentralised and Mutual ...

The decentralised procedure (DCP) is a European authorisation route resulting in a mutually recognised product (MRP). The difference between MRP and DCP is that a product must already be authorised in at least one Member State on a national basis in order for MRP to be used.

### Heads of Medicines Agencies: Medicines Approval system

The Co-ordination group for Mutual recognition and Decentralised procedures - human (CMDh), was set up in Directive 2004/27/EC for the examination of any question relating to marketing authorisations of a medicinal product in two or more Member States in accordance with the mutual recognition procedure or the decentralised procedure.

### Heads of Medicines Agencies: CMDh

A marketing authorisation holder can use the mutual recognition procedure (MRP) several times for the same marketing authorisation after completion of the first MRP or decentralised procedure (DCP). Consequently, the recognition of a marketing authorisation can be extended to include extra member states.

### Mutual recognition procedure | Application procedures ...

The mutual recognition procedure, which is applicable to the majority of conventional medicinal products, is based on the recognition of a pre-existing national marketing authorisation by one or more EU countries. The decentralised procedure, where the application for marketing authorisation is submitted simultaneously in several EU countries, one being chosen as the "Reference Member State". National authorisations are still available for medicinal products sold in an individual EU country.

### Centralised, decentralised, mutual recognition and ...

Coordination group for Mutual recognition and Decentralised procedures (CMDv) which consists of representatives of all EU member states, including Norway, Lichtenstein, and Iceland, provides the process of mutual recognition of marketing authorisation for medicinal products in veterinary use.

### Mutual recognition procedure and decentralised procedure ...

the Decentralised Procedure (DCP) the Mutual Recognition Procedure (MRP). Both, MRP and DCP, are open for all applications for marketing authorisation which do not fall within the mandatory scope of the Centralised Procedures.

**BfArM - DCP / MRP**

For the mutual recognition procedure, a common renewal date should be agreed by the Member States and the applicant. Where a product is not already authorised in another member state, the Decentralised (DC) procedure may be used for obtaining a Marketing Authorisation (MA) for Malta.

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
